LETTER OF AGREEMENT

August 3, 2022

Pursuant to our recent conversations, Kanawha County Emergency Ambulance Authority (the client) agrees to engage **TSG Consulting II**, **LLC** (the agency) as a consultant in West Virginia to provide state government relations consultation and related services. Specifically, TSG will assist the client in interfacing with state legislators and policy makers regarding EMS and healthcare issues. In some instances, the agency may be asked to provide public relations services and strategic advice.

West Virginia state law defines a lobbyist as "a person who, through communication with a government officer or employee, promotes, advocates or otherwise attempts to influence legislation, rules or regulations (W.Va. Code § 6B-3-1)." Therefore, Tom Susman and Phil Shimer of TSG Consulting II, LLC will register with the West Virginia Ethics Commission as client's lobbyists and will be responsible for filling all reports required by the Commission.

TSG Consulting II, LLC is not an employee of the client. TSG Consulting is a contractor to the client and will not engage lawmakers or other on behalf of client without the permission of the client. TSG Consulting will work with the legislature and the executive branch regarding the legislation, rules or regulations that are of importance to the client.

The agency shall provide the services usually rendered by a state government relations firm and will represent the client before the West Virginia Legislature, executive branch, and other state government agencies and regulatory bodies. The agency agrees to use reasonable efforts to satisfy the requirements of the client for government relations services by, among other things, 1) engaging relevant members of the legislature, governor's office, and state agencies as needed, 2) working as necessary to meet requirements of the client, 3) providing advice on health and regulatory matters as requested and, 4) providing other services as requested by the client. Prior to engaging in outreach to governmental officials the agency will seek the approval of the client to the degree possible.

The retainer for these services will be invoiced on an hourly basis subject to the following schedule:

Tom Susman, Partner \$150 per hour

Phil Shimer, Of Counsel \$140 per hour

Jim Wallace PR Services \$75 per hour

Hours worked by the agency will be billed monthly and will include a description of the services provided. During the entire term of this Agreement, any additional out-of-pocket expenses will be pre-approved by the client. Ordinary office expenses and local commuting will be the sole responsibility of the agency.

The term of this contract shall be for period starting August 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023 and shall continue on a month to month basis after June 30, 2023. Either party may cancel this agreement with a 30-day notice.
